Empowering the next generation: Young Leaders in Diabetes (YLD)

The Young Leaders in Diabetes (YLD) Programme is a global initiative of the International Diabetes Federation (IDF) that empowers young people living with diabetes to become confident and effective advocates, leaders and changemakers in their communities. By investing in youth leadership, YLD helps strengthen diabetes advocacy and supports IDF Members in delivering meaningful, community-driven impact.

What is the YLD Programme?

YLD is a three-year leadership programme that provides young advocates with the tools to implement change in their communities. Over the course of three years, Young Leaders gain access to IDF expertise, capacity-building sessions, and global advocacy networks, equipping them with the skills and confidence they need. A core element of the programme is learning about project management skills: all Young Leaders must implement a diabetes-related project at the national or local level, in close collaboration with their IDF Member.

Driving impact through leadership - YLD objectives:

- Improve the lives of young people living with diabetes
- Raise awareness of all types of diabetes, prevention and access to quality care
- Challenge diabetes-related stigma and discrimination
- Support IDF Members and Regions through innovative, youth-led projects

The role of IDF Members

Engaged IDF Members are central to the success of YLD. By supporting and mentoring Young Leaders, Members benefit from fresh perspectives, innovative ideas and the development of future organisational leaders. Each Young Leader collaborates with their nominating Member to contribute to an existing initiative or develop a new project that addresses local diabetes needs.

Next call for applications opening in April

IDF Members are encouraged to identify and nominate committed young people who are ready to dedicate time, energy and creativity to strengthening diabetes advocacy and improving the lives of people living with diabetes. Careful selection and ongoing support will ensure the greatest possible impact for communities and Members alike. IDF Advocacy will circulate the call for applications to all IDF Members in April.

Western Pacific Young Leaders: Project Highlights

Across the Western Pacific, Young Leaders are transforming their lived experiences into action. Through advocacy, creativity and community engagement, they are raising awareness, strengthening support systems and inspiring change for people living with diabetes.

MEET THE WESTERN PACIFIC REGION YOUTH LEADERS



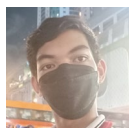
Aqilah Zaidi – Singapore

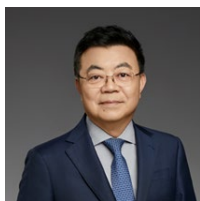
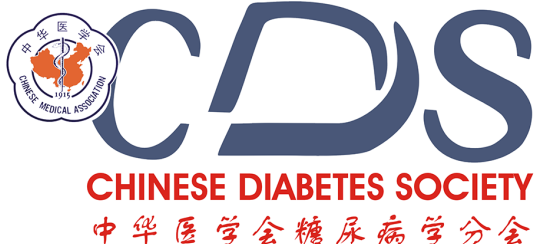
Requirements to join the YLD trainee programme

- Live with any type of diabetes
- Aged between 18 and 30 by 30 November 2026
- Able to communicate effectively in English (a video interview may be requested)
- Have an active connection with an IDF Member Association
- Be passionate about making a difference in the diabetes community
- Have the desire to develop, execute and report a diabetes project agreed with an IDF Member Association
- Have reliable access to the internet for communication and reporting purposes
- Be available two to four hours per month for the YLD programme

The Chinese Diabetes Society (CDS) is a professional society directly under the Chinese Medical Association (CMA), established in Shanghai in October 1991. Its predecessor was the Diabetes Group of the Chinese Society of Endocrinology, founded in 1985. In 1985, the Diabetes Group of the Chinese Society of Endocrinology was established at the Second National Congress of Endocrinology held in Wuhan. In 1987, with the approval of the Ministry of Health of the People's Republic of China, the group joined the International Diabetes Federation (IDF) under the name "Chinese Diabetes Society." In 1991, the Third Sino-Japanese Friendship Diabetes Academic Exchange and the Fourth National Diabetes Academic Conference were held in Shanghai, at which the CDS was officially established, marking a new stage in the prevention and treatment of diabetes in our country.

To prevent, treat, and eradicate diabetes through education, research, and medical care

BANTING AWARD TO PROF TAKASHI KADOWAKI

Announcement: 2026 Banting Medal for Scientific Achievement Award

Former Chair of the Western Pacific Region, **Takashi Kadowaki, MD, PhD**, will be honoured with the 2026 Banting Medal for Scientific Achievement at the **ADA Conference**.

Prof. Kadowaki is the President of Toranomon Hospital and Professor Emeritus at the University of Tokyo, and currently serves as President of the Japanese Association of Medical Sciences. He has made seminal contributions to the biology and genetics of insulin action, insulin resistance, and type 2 diabetes. His discovery of adiponectin receptors (AdipoR1/R2) and the elucidation of their structure and function represent a major scientific breakthrough.

Prof. Kadowaki has published over 800 papers and has received numerous prestigious awards, including the Japan Academy Prize, the Manpei Suzuki International Prize for Diabetes Research, and the Claude Bernard Award from the EASD. Please join us in celebrating Prof. Kadowaki's continued and outstanding achievements. If at ADA, please attend and congratulate Prof. Kadowaki in person.

PUBLICATION of Type 1 Diabetes Care in the WPR

An international team recently published an overview of Type 1 diabetes related health outcomes in our region. Using the Type 1 diabetes index a wide range of healthy years of life lost per person with diabetes was shown, ranging from 21 to 46 years, as shown in the Figure. They also mapped availability of CGM and insulin pumps, and whilst available in over half of the WPR Countries and regions, only three countries provided subsidies, in spite of known benefit. Advocacy is needed and collaborative approaches may prove helpful. The paper is PubMed listed.

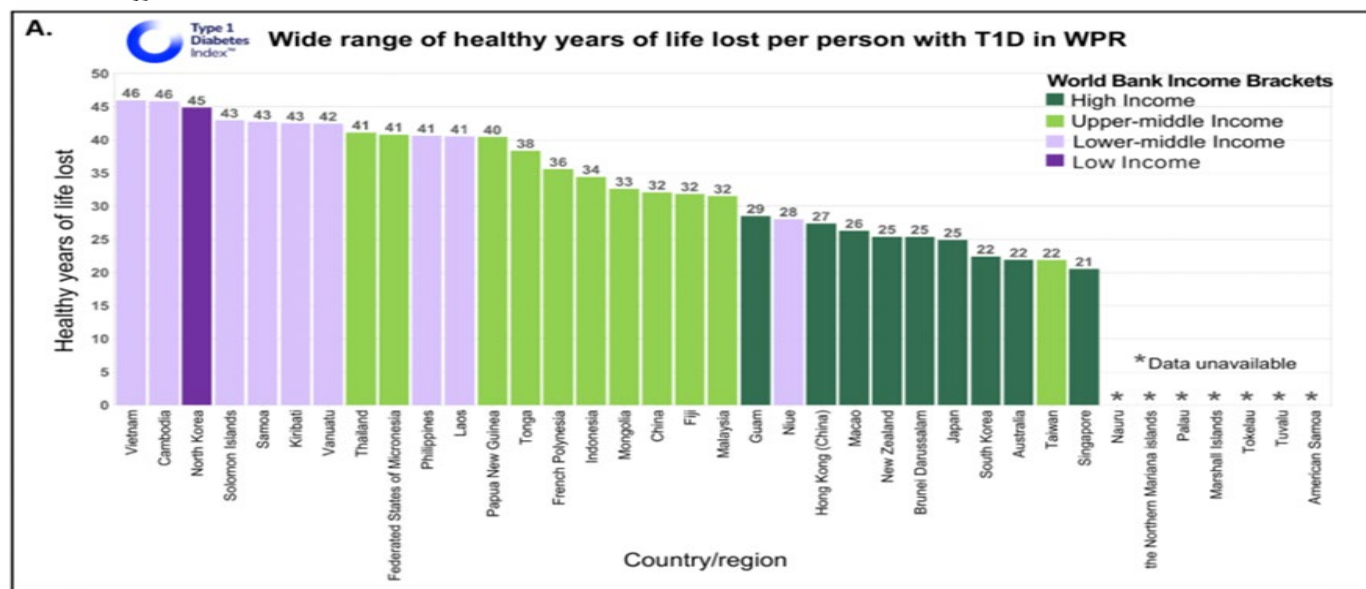
